

## PCN at a Glance



- This PCN Process involves Retail Storefront Activity Only
- The Retail Storefront application process is limited to Social Equity Applicants (SEAs) until
  January 1, 2025. As such, Prospective Social Equity Applicants seeking to apply for a Retail
  storefront license can apply one of two ways:
  - Applicants seeking to apply in a Community Plan Area yet to reach Undue Concentration
     via Phase 3 Retail Round 2 lottery
  - Through the PCN Process, if the Applicant is seeking to to apply in a Community Plan
     Area subject to a finding of Undue Concentration

## PCN at a Glance



- Local law has established that per <u>Community Plan Area, DCR is authorized to issue 1 Retail</u> license per 10,000 residents.
  - EMMDs and Phase 3 Retail Round 1 (First 100) \*
- As such each Community Plan Area, has its own limit on the number of Retail Licenses that DCR may issue, based on the size of its population.
- Community Plan Areas are subject to a finding of Undue Concentration once DCR has issued all of the licenses available in a given Community Plan Area.
- The PCN process is outlined in <u>LAMC Sec 104.03(a)(4)</u>
- Therefore an Applicant seeking to apply in a Community Plan Area subject to a finding of Undue Concentration must go through this PCN process before they can submit an application for a Retail license to DCR.

## PCN PILOT at a Glance



- A total 53 PCN requests that have been submitted to DCR. (47 have paid the PCN filing fee)
  - Six PCN requests may be abandoned due to unpaid fees
- On February 25, 2021, DCR began transmitting PCN requests to the City Clerk.
- These PCN requests will be transmitted in three batches:
  - 1st Batch 2/25 through 3/9 Completed
  - 2nd Batch 3/23 through 3/30 Completed
  - 3rd Batch 4/15 through 4/22 Pending



## PCN & PLUM



### At PLUM...

- DCR Staff will make a brief presentation stating the geophysical facts of the request:
  - Where the Business Premises is located
  - The zone of the parcel where the Business Premises is located
  - If there are sensitive uses that have been identified within 700 feet of the Business Premises location\*
- LAPD will provide the crime statistics and their position on the application
- The Applicant will provide testimony
- Council Office may or may not provide position on the record
- Public Comment

## PCN & PLUM



### After PLUM....

- In coordination with the Council President's Office, the City Clerk will publish the Council agenda within 90 calendar days of the :
  - With a recommendation from PLUM for approval or denial, it will publish the findings to support or deny the request
  - With no recommendation from PLUM
- If the matter is continued beyond the 90 calendar day limit, the matter will be denied as operation of law.

## PCN Standards



- The existing commercial cannabis businesses in the requestor's Community Plan Area are concentrated in one area, such that the requestor's business, located in another area, would serve the public convenience or necessity; or
- The proposed business premises would serve an area of increased density or consumer traffic, including but not limited to an entertainment or commercial corridor, such that the proposed location would serve the public convenience or necessity by satisfying a higher demand for retail locations; or

## **PCN Standards**



- The proposed business premises would be located in an area with a high number of unlicensed commercial cannabis retail establishments, such that an additional licensed location would serve the public convenience or necessity by satisfying a higher demand for retail locations and reduce patronage of unlicensed establishments;
- The requestor's business would include clear specified public safety related features, such that the operation of the requestor's business would serve the public convenience or necessity by likely reducing crime or nuisance activity in the surrounding area,

#### PUBLIC CONVENIENCE OR NECESSITY (PCN) PROCEDURE

The Cannabis Procedures Ordinance limits the number of Retail, Cultivation and Volatile-Manufacturing Commercial Cannabis Activity Licenses by Community Plan Area (CPA) based on the definition of Undue Concentration under Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 104-01[40](48). An area is considered unduly concentrated when DCR issues the maximum number of these License types in that CPA.

Pursuant to LAMC Section 104.03(a)(4), Applicants seeking to engage in Retail, Cultivation, and Valtile-Manufacturing Commercial Cannabis Activity in a CPA that is unduly concentrated are required to file a request that the City Council find that approval of the License application would serve a public convenience or necessity (PCN) supported by evidence in the record. This billetin, in conjunction with the PCN Worldfow (<u>Lic-4001-WP</u>), provides general information, procedure and requirements for an Applicant to submit a PCN request to the City Council.

#### Overview of Responsibilities

#### Applicant Responsibilities:

- Reach out to key stakeholders as early as possible in the process.
- Perform due diligence to verify that the location of the Business Premises complies with LAMC Section 105.02(a)(1).
- Complete and submit the "Public Convenience or Necessity Finding Request Form" ("PCN Request Form") to DCR.
- Form" ("PCN Request Form") to DCR.

  Pay the PCN Filing Fee and the Written
  Notice Fee.
- After the City Clerk assigns a Council File to the PCN request, complete and send the "Stakeholder Input Request Form" ("Stakeholder Form") to key stakeholders.
- Submit any additional documentation in support of the PCN request to DCR prior to the City Council meeting.
- Subscribe to the Council File to receive notifications from the City Clerk related to the PCN request.

#### DCR Actions:

- Review PCN request.
- Transmit PCN request to the City Clerk within 30 days of the PCN Filing Fee payment.
- Provide Written Notice in accordance with LAMC Section 104.05(b)(1).
- Transmit any additional documentation from the Applicant to the City Clerk.
- Communicate Council's final action to the Applicant.

### City Clerk Actions:

 Issue a Council File Number to the PCN request and inform the City Council or processing deadlines.

### City Council Actions:

 May schedule the item in Council Committee and/or City Council within 90 days of the PCN request receipt.
